### School attendance

Thank you to all of our families who continue to prioritise their child's attendance at school. Our goal this term is to have our projected unapproved absences less than one day per student. Currently we have an average projected unapproved absence of 1.2 days per student.

Absences are not approved by our school when students are away from school unnecessarily – for example, taking a long weekend on school day, visiting family or friends on a school day or taking a day off for a birthday.



In addition, when parents do not notify us of the reason for an absence, this absence is Unexplained, and therefore unapproved. Parents are required to contact the school to

provide an explanation on the day of the student absence. If no explanation is given, the school must attempt to contact the parent or legal guardian and seek clarification of the reason for the absence.

**Assistant Principal's Report** 

On Friday, we are holding our first Clear Café for the 2024 school year. Over the term, students have been earning Clear Cards for demonstrating our values of Collaboration, Learning Engagement and Respect

Each Clear Card a student earns converts to a point. As students earn Clear Cards, the points are tallied to their name. Students can choose to spend their points each term at a scheduled Clear Café or save their points for a 'bigger' reward later in the year.
