

2025 Structures and Staffing

We are currently busy preparing for 2025 and arranging our school structures. Our overall number of classes will remain the same next year, and we will continue to offer our specialist programs of Visual Arts, Science and Technology, Performing Arts, Physical Education and Indonesian.

Anneliese Arrott-Watt will be taking family leave from the start of 2025, and Anneliese will be replaced by Leanne Jacques.

Megan Shemmell will be transferring to Topirum Primary School in 2025. Megan is being replaced by Olivia Okev.

Jessica Skinner has accepted a position at Barton Primary School next year, and we are currently recruiting staff to fill this position.

Thank you to Jess and Megan for their work and dedication at Somers Primary School! You will be missed by our whole school community. We wish you both all the best.

Our MSL tutor Nicola Tucker will also be leaving us at the end of this year to focus on other areas. Thank you Nicola for all of your work supporting students in the MSL program. We are very excited to announce an expansion of this program in 2025, with our Learning Specialist Clare Munro now trained in Multisensory Structured Language intervention. In 2025 Clare will not have a classroom teaching load, but working to improve our Multi-Tiered System of Supports across the school, with a focus on improving classroom teaching practice, small group targeted intervention and support, and intensive support for students with a disability.

School Review

This week we held our first day of our four-year School Review. Our school review panel consists of school reviewer Heather Norbury, Challenge Partners Joanne Barnes (Assistant Principal, Red Hill Consolidated School) and Marc De Ley (Principal, Topirum Primary School), Acting Senior Education Improvement Leader Sally Webb, Kirsty and myself.

Schools undertake a school review every 4 years to inform the directions of the school's 4-year School Strategic Plan (SSP). Schools complete a pre-review self-evaluation, then the school review panel considers the PRSE and undertakes additional fieldwork activities such as classroom observations, focus groups and interviews. The review concludes with a report proposing draft goals, targets and key improvement strategies for the school's next SSP.

The school reviewer also completes an assessment of the school's compliance with the Curriculum and Student Learning Minimum Standard. Schools' compliance with the other Minimum Standards for registered schools is also assessed.

On Tuesday, our review panel validated our school review and recognised our excellent results, positive school climate and ongoing improvement. The panel set some directions for further evidence gathering, which will take place on our second review day on November 11th.

Computer Upgrades

Thanks to Bendigo Bank for our 36 new computers! This year the bank has extended its Arts Fair Sponsorship, providing over \$17 000 to purchase new computers for our school. We have received these computers, and they will be distributed to classrooms over the next few weeks.

World Teachers Day

Compass School Management System

Over the next few months, our school will be transitioning to the Compass School Management System to enhance school communication, attendance marking, parent payments and more. From 25th November, 2024, we will be using Compass School Manager as our Parent Portal. Using our Parent Portal, you will be able to:

- View up-to-date class and school attendance information
- Approve or enter upcoming or past absences for your child
- Download, print and approve upcoming excursions
- Pay school fees, charges and contributions
- Update your registered email and mobile number (used for SMS alerts) details
- Access information regarding upcoming events and news

Future functions that we will introduce in 2025 will include:

- Accessing your child's Student Progress and Semester Reports
- Booking your Parent/Student/Teacher conferences

2025 Student scholarships for Grade 4 – Year 12

The Department of Education administers a range of scholarships on behalf of various trusts. Scholarships are available to students currently enrolled in Grade 4 to Year 11 in 2024 and students enrolled in Year 12 in 2024 who plan on undertaking tertiary studies in 2025.

Applicants for the scholarships are evaluated on their:

- · academic achievement
- · participation in school activities
- · community involvement.

Scholarships are either one-off payments or available for the duration of the student's course/study. Scholarships support students and families to assist with the cost of education and engagement in further study at primary, secondary and tertiary level. Grade 4 to Year 11 scholarships are one-off payments between \$300 and \$1,500.


