## **Assistant Principal's Report**

On Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> March, The Resilience project are offering a free one-hour webinar to our families. The webinar outlines a whole school approach to enhancing student wellbeing and provides information to parents and carers about practical strategies to practise Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness (GEM) at home. #### Inspire

This week, our Grade 3-6 students participated in their first Inspire session. Activities on offer included, Jewellery Making, Surf Lifesaving, MasterChef, Gardening, Yoga, Art and Design and Claymation.
