#### Positive Home School Communication

At Somers Primary School we recognise that positive communication between home and school means that we can work together to ensure our students are happy, engaged and making great progress at school. We pride ourselves in ensuring that our staff are approachable and accessible for our families. We encourage our parents to reach out to their child's teacher if they need to, and this can be via Compass Connect, email, phone or face to face. To support your child's learning and communicate their progress, all teachers are asked to post weekly learning intentions on Compass, and we hold face-to-face interviews twice a year, and Student Support Group meetings four times per year for selected students. We also encourage parents to contact their child's teacher if they would like feedback on how their child is progressing and raise any concerns or request assistance

# ANZAC DAY


#### ANZAC Day

on the school oval from 8.15am - 8.45am


